22 Tuesday (1) Simon Ochieng has been tempted to discouragement because of the slow growth of the work in **Funyula** – this especially when one of his right hand men relocated to Kigali (Rwanda). He had hoped to send him for TPC studies. (2) Kalisto Odongo in Bukhalilire continues to pray for a day when one of the young men will begin this TPC training. (3) Martin Mukoyan and the church in **Bungoma** Town pray for a church building on their plot.

23 Wednesday **KU** leaves early tomorrow for Kenya having been unable to go for more than two years. He will be there for 3 weeks, teaching in the TPC, fellowshipping with brethren, and visiting work in Meru and Rendille. Pray for his wife Priscilla as she remains behind in UK.

24 Thursday Trinity **Crisis Pregnancy** Ministry continues to be set up as it already serves a number of women in difficult situations who are tempted in various ways to sin as to how they handle their pregnancies. 2 Wednesday (1) MI is preaching tonight at JKUAT CU on *Reason For Faith*. Hundreds of **college** students gather to hear the word of God. This is where contacts are made with students some of whom pursue membership at TBC and other biblical churches in the city and some of them end up into the gospel ministry. (2) In 2021 the Lord blessed us with 18 **children** who were born to church members. Please pray that they would be raised in the discipline of the Lord. Pray for expectant mothers in our midst – and especially the Aluvisia's who are due to have their child born anytime now.

3 Thursday The first **TPC** module for 2022 took place successfully in January. Let us thank God for hearing our prayers concerning this pastoral college - Mark Hatfield and Nathaniel Davidson taught hermeneutics to twelve students. The Lord was pleased to grant that two new students from Pokot (David Chemolok & William Siwanyang) joined the college. Please pray for them and all the students to be equipped by the Lord for the pastoral work through this college.

4 Friday (1) MI, Martin Omondi (a deacon), Mark & Cheryl Hatfield visited **Kericho** and preached at the new Grace Baptist Church, led by David Ngetich, on the 23rd of Jan. In the afternoon, three more messages were preached at Glory Baptist Church, Chebang'ang'. (2) Mark & Cheryl **Hatfield** travel back home on Monday 7th after a number of weeks in Kenya. Thank the Lord for their love for the work of God in TBCN and their ministry here. Pray for their pre-travel testing and safe travel back to South Carolina.

9 Wednesday The **Kiswahili** ministry continues as DK does an exposition through the Sermon on the Mount. It must be pointed out that there is no known content on the internet which has expository preaching in Kiswahili!

10 Thursday (1) The Thursday **Prayer** meeting over Zoom continues to be one of the refreshing times for the church as many of us join in to pray. Our prayer remains that the whole church and more may log in and be part of this hour and half of prayer. (2) MI will be meeting with the potential leaders of a new fast growing Baptist Church in Nairobi called **Hope City** led by Solomon Muigai, with whom we have good relations.

11 Friday The **Meaty Forum** resumes today. The subject is *Evangelism* which is our emphasis this year. Two of the TBCN elders and Solomon Muigai will be joining us on the panel where Paul Gachungi will be moderating. We desire that the saints will be faithful witnesses of Christ, where the Lord has strategically placed them.

12 Saturday The Children's Ministry has continued to recover and grow after the recent lockdowns. Today we are having a *SS Teachers Training* for those involved in this ministry, with the aim of equipping and encouraging them in evangelising the young in our midst. Pray for DK as he takes the teachers through the training and as he leads this ministry.

It is described as the worst drought in decades, and the Government has declared it a national emergency. [From Rendille see https://reliefweb.int/report/kenya/human-lives-stake-drought-ravages-kenya] Isaac Erot of Katilu (Turkana) reports that this has been so difficult for the church members. The two villages that they were reaching with the gospel have either moved or scattered or both! There is discussion about establishing contacts in Lodwar with an aim of a church. Exploratory trips have been made. Please pray.

17 Thursday MI and the team (Martin, Hatfields) had planned to visit **South Nyanza** between 24th and 31st Jan., but had to return to Nairobi on 26th. because of sickness. Daniel Ngollo of Osani took over the programme.

18 Friday KU has made tremendous steps in writing the **book** on his ministry and TBC's history. He submitted the manuscripts to various brethren who considered it in the month of Jan. We hope to move to the editorial stage and want to have the book published in the first half of the year. Please pray that this will encourage many who read it to look to the Lord like the watchmen wait for the morning.

19 Saturday The **Annual General Meeting** takes place today, when the church budget will be presented by the deacons for approval. We shall also consider the various ministry reports and based on them evaluate the status of the church. Please pray for unanimity and unity of purpose.
