

KORR REPORT MAY 2019

Gratitude

The members of Korr Baptist Church and the neighbourhood were very grateful due to the food supply that they received from their brothers from Nairobi Trinity Church Donholm. May God bless them due to their generous contributions.

The services are as usual. We begin the morning service at 9 a.m. and end at 1 p.m. The second service starts at 3 p.m. to 4.30 p.m. on Sundays. Other activities in the midweek are evangelism on Tuesdays and Fridays, Bible study on Wednesdays, and prayer meeting on Thursdays.

Evangelism

We visited Lekuchula and Losidan with the brothers from Nairobi as we took some of the foodstuff to the schools there and a few selected people. In both places we were highly appreciated by the residents and they received the food with gladness. Brother Mark preached the word of God on both occasions. We have been to Lekuchula again and conversed with some women who were able to hear the Rendille language, since some of the younger speak the Samburu language. They also expressed their gratitude concerning the small portion of food they received the previous week from the Nairobi brethren.

Uyam

We thank the Lord for giving us favour among the Uyam community which is 3 kms. from Korr Trinity Church compound. Last Sunday from that community ten women joined our Church service and promised that they wished to be members of Trinity Church since the brothers have been visiting them for a long time. May you pray God that there will be a genuine repentance among that goob (village).

Goob Dogo

Here we have two mothers with their 5 children who have also started coming to the Church. We hope that God is working among their souls. Last Sunday at Korr (9th. June) most attenders sat on the floor due to lack of enough chairs. We need more prayer so that the Lord will intervene.

Galdeeylan

The people of this goob have started showing interest on the gospel. We hope that God will save some from that community.

Other goobs we reach with the gospel, mostly on Thursdays, are Urowween, Matarbaah, Tubcha, Ongeli, Nebeey, Nahagaan, Goob Orre. We appreciate what the Lord is doing among the elder men because in the beginning they couldn't listen to anyone who opposes their traditional way of worship (such as sooriyo). But today some of them have started to see its invalidity. So let us pray that the Lord will open their eyes and see the Christ on the cross as the only sacrifice that God had ordained.

Borehole

Due to the problem of water in Korr, we ask you to pray for us that we will have a borehole in the compound. It will be a great help to the members of the Church and the community as a whole.

Drought

The following months through September it seems there will be no rain until November. So we pray God who according to His words in the book of 1 Peter 5:7 that He will care for us. He knows more than we know.

Church building completion

We believe that God is drawing His people to come and hear His word. The concentration on the gospel preaching is being affected because the walls are incomplete and the Church is on the roadside from Goob Dogo to the market centre. It is as if those who are inside are outside. And Korr is a place of much wind and this interferes with the attention of the people. Pray for us that the Lord will see this need and do something.

Latrine

The Church building, where Stanley resides, is more than 100 m. from the existing latrine. Pray for us so that we will have another one nearby. It is too far for one who wants to use it even during Sunday service and it is not even safe to walk in Korr in the dark due to wild animals such as hyenas.

Pray also for the work of the Lord in these three stations – Korr, Lekuchula and Losidan.
